You have been referred to the multidisciplinary foot clinic because you have an active foot problem, likely connected to Diabetes.

Please ensure you give yourself plenty of time to arrive for your appointment. On arrival, check in at the diabetes reception.

If you are unable to attend, please contact the department on: 01744 646200 and press Option 1.

- The multidisciplinary clinic is managed by a team of Consultants, Specialty Doctors, Diabetes Specialist Nurses and Podiatrists.
- On your first visit, your patient journey will include: Completion of clinic assessments, i.e. height, weight, HbA1c (average finger–prick blood sugar test).
- The Diabetes Specialist Nurse will document your medical history and a list of your medication. Please bring your blood glucose meter and your medications list to the appointment, if possible.
- You will be asked to sign a consent form to permit staff to take photographs of your foot. This is to monitor the progress of your foot problem.
- The Podiatrist will remove your foot dressings, complete various foot assessments and discuss the findings.
- A holistic review of your foot problem and overall Diabetes care will be provided by a specialist doctor in Diabetes and together a management plan will be formulated.

- The foot will then be re-dressed by the Podiatrist or Diabetes Specialist Nurse.
- Further appointments may be planned. You will be discharged to the community team once your foot problem has resolved.
- A clinical outcome letter will be sent to you, your GP, and any community teams involved in your care.
