Under the Freedom of Information Act, I would like to request answers to the following questions in relation to H.Pylori testing in hospitals throughout your Trust please.

- 1. How do you test for *H. Pylori* infection during upper GI endoscopies? Please specify what tests you use, e.g., Culture Biopsy (Pathology), Urease.
 - Endoscopy: Urease test
 - Pathology: Faecal ELISA assay
 - Biopsy, culture, and sensitivity available
- 2. How many H. Pylori tests are performed in a typical month?
 - Urease Test: Approx. 250 monthly
 - Faecal ELISA assay: Approx. 700/month
 - Biopsy, culture, and sensitivity: Estimate <10/year
- 3. Who decides to purchase H. Pylori tests?
 - Endoscopy: Endoscopy Governance Meeting
 - Pathology: Operational Managers / Service Leads in Microbiology
- 4. Which H.Pylori test(s) do you use most?

Please refer to answer two. In Pathology: Werfen H.Pylori STAR ELISA assay using the DS2 machine.

5. Why do you use these tests most?

ELISA, convenient, non-invasive, used in large numbers by primary care. Urease test, invasive but convenient to use at the time of endoscopy procedure in secondary care.

6. Where in the hospital is the test usually done, and by whom?

Endoscopy, by the endoscopist and endoscopy nurses.

7. What medication do you use to treat H, Pylori? Please give drug name and brand.

1st line. Lansoprazole 30mg BD and Amoxicillin 1g BD and either Clarithromycin 500mg BD or Metronidazole 400mg BD for 7 days. Generic brands used.

- 8. What is the typical cost per test? Please give an estimate for unbranded or laboratory own tests.
 - ELISA Test £17.50
 - BioHit £1.86
