What to Expect

You have received a sedative drug whilst in the Emergency Department.

This is usually given so that it is more comfortable for you to have a painful or unpleasant procedure done.

It is normal to have a short period of memory loss as a result of being given a sedative drug.

The vast majority of people have an uneventful recovery.

Things to do after Sedation

- Rest
- Drink plenty of fluids and eat a light diet.
- Ensure there is a responsible adult looking after you for 24 hours.

Things to avoid after Sedation

- Do not drive a vehicle for 24 hours.
- Do not operate machinery.
- Do not drink alcohol.
- Do not make important decisions.
- Do not care for dependent adults or children without help.
