- Your wound may become tender when you return home. If you are in pain you may take your normal painkillers as directed on the packaging. Do not exceed the stated dose.
- □ Ensure you keep the wound/s clean and dry.
- Do not remove your dressings until you return to the dressing clinic, unless you have been instructed to do so.
- Your wound may bleed following surgery. This can be quite normal as the blood supply returns to normal after an anaesthetic. If bleeding does occur, press firmly on the area with the gauze supplied, for at least ten minutes. If bleeding continues to occur, contact the hospital using the numbers given to you.
- If the Doctor has prescribed you any medications, please take as instructed and directed on the label.
- Do not participate in sports or any activity that causes exertion for at least days after surgery.
- Avoid putting clothing over your head. It is best to wear blouses/shirts and cardigans, to avoid injury to your wound.

- After surgery on your face and especially near your eyes, sit up as much as possible as this will help to reduce any swelling.
- After surgery to your arm, elevate it whenever possible. Resting your arm on a pillow will help until your next appointment.
- After an anaesthetic to make your arm/hand/finger(s) numb, be sure to check that they have normal feeling, colour and temperature after 3-4 hours. If it does not appear normal to you, do not hesitate to contact the hospital immediately.
- Your skin may appear white around the area that you have been operated on. This is due to the local an aesthetic and should return to normal in approximately 2-4 hours.
