Blepharoplasty

Eyelid surgery (blepharoplasty) is cosmetic surgery to remove excess skin or fat from the eyelids. The aim is to improve hooded or drooping eyelids or eye bags. A blepharoplasty can be done under local anaesthetic with sedation or under general anaesthetic.

Surgery on the upper eyelids generally involves:

- Making a cut (incision) along the eyelid crease in the natural skin fold of the eyelid.
- Removing excess skin, fat or muscle.
- Closing the incision the scar will usually be hidden in the natural fold of the eyelid.



Upper Blepharoplasty

Surgery on the lower eyelids generally involves:

- Making an incision either just below the lower eyelashes or on the inside of the lower eyelid.
- Repositioning or removing fat from the bags under the eyes, and sometimes also a small amount of skin.
- Supporting the muscles and tendon of the eyelid if necessary closing the incision.



Lower Blepharoplasty

Discharge Information

- Prop your head up with pillows for a couple of days when resting, to reduce swelling.
- If you have been given eye ointment, please apply as instructed with a clean finger-tip or directly on the wound and gently apply to the area where the stitches are (if applicable).
- Hold a cold pack to your eye for a few days try an ice pack wrapped in a tea towel, this will help to reduce swelling. Do not place ice directly onto the skin.
- You may benefit from wearing sunglasses to protect your eyes from the sun and wind.
- Your eyes may be sore and tender, please take simple analgesia such as paracetamol, always follow the instructions on the packet.

If any bleeding occurs, apply direct pressure with clean gauze. If it does not stop, seek medical advice

You may experience the following:

- Puffy, numb eyelids that are difficult to close at night.
- Irritated, sensitive or watery eyes this may last a few weeks.
- Bruising that looks like a black eye.
- Scars these eventually fade to almost be invisible.

Things to avoid:

- Strenuous activity and swimming for a few days.
- Smoking, as smoke can irritate your eyes.
- Wearing contact lenses or rubbing your eyes.
- Driving, for a couple of days, if your eyes are blurred or swollen.
- Rubbing or touching the eyes with a used handkerchief or tissue.
