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Cystoscopy Procedure

Cystoscopy involves inspection of the bladder and urethra with a telescope passed along the penis in men or through the urethra (waterpipe) in women.

Urethral dilatation (stretching of the water pipe) to make passing water (urine) easier.

Vesical-distension (stretching the bladder) this can improve your ability to hold larger amounts of urine.

Cysto-diathermy this is burning away any growths found in the bladder.

Biopsies (taking a sample of tissue) may be taken and sent to laboratory for investigation.

We normally use either a general anaesthetic (where you will be asleep) or a spinal anaesthetic (where you will be unable to feel anything from the waist down).

We may give you an injection of antibiotics before the procedure.

We put a telescope into your bladder through the urethra (waterpipe) to inspect the interior of your bladder.

We may take small biopsies from any abnormal areas and cauterise the biopsy sites to stop any bleeding.

Post Operative Information

Occasionally, we put in a bladder catheter which is removed subsequently; this is more likely if we have taken biopsies.

Most patients go home on the same day as their procedure, provided they have passed urine satisfactorily.

- It is normal to experience mild cystitis-like symptoms (burning sensation when passing urine). Drinking plenty of fluids (mainly water) should improve this.
- Expect to see some mild bleeding in your urine for a short time afterwards.
- If you develop a fever, frequent passage of urine, severe pain on passing urine, inability to pass urine or worsening bleeding, seek medical advice immediately. Attend your Walk In Centre/Urgent Care Centre or Phone 111 for advice.
- Simple analgesia such as paracetamol will help ease any discomfort. Please read instructions carefully regarding dosage.
- You may return to work when you are comfortable enough or as your surgeon advises.
- You will be given a copy of your discharge summary and a copy will also be sent to your GP.
