It is the crowning achievement in a truly exceptional year in the Trust's history, being named Trust of the Year at the national HSJ Awards 2019, followed the 'Outstanding' rating from the CQC and coming top in the country in both the NHS Staff Survey and the Patient Led Assessment of the Care Environment. A truly proud moment for everyone connected to Team STHK.

The HSJ Trust of the Year title is the most prestigious of prizes available to an NHS organisation and is also one of the most fiercely contested. The awards are renowned for shining a bright spotlight on the inspirational ideas and initiatives that make a crucial difference every day to the NHS.

Following an extensive judging process, undertaken by a wide range of well-

respected figures from across the UK healthcare community, STHK has been awarded the title in recognition of its outstanding contribution to healthcare over the past 12 months. The Trust triumphed over a short list containing a list of high profile organisations including: Brighton and Sussex University, Chelsea and Westminster FT and Newcastle upon Tyne Hospitals FT.

The HSJ Awards judges said: "This Trust presented a superb all-round application, backed-up by robust outcomes for patients and the workforce; this was sustained over time and in challenging circumstances. It was felt that this Trust was strongly placed in the local community with inspiring patient and staff stories. The Trust demonstrated excellent staff engagement and development which is paying dividends in workforce retention."



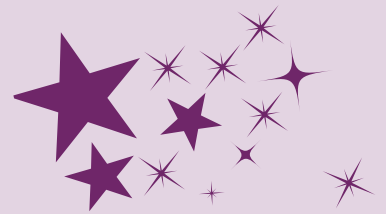

## Academy of Fab Stuff visit STHK



Hot off the heels of being named 'Trust of the Year', STHK welcomed Roy Lilley and Jon Wilks from the Academy of Fab NHS Staff to Whiston Hospital. They were keen to find out more about all of the innovative work taking place across the Trust including how we are leading the way in telemedicine, offering video consultations to patients who are recovering from stroke and plastic surgery.

**ISSUE RESOLVED!** The Outpatient and PAS Admin teams have joined efforts and rectified this immediately.

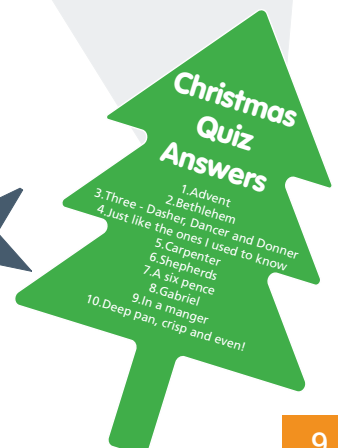

## Special little people raising money for special little babies

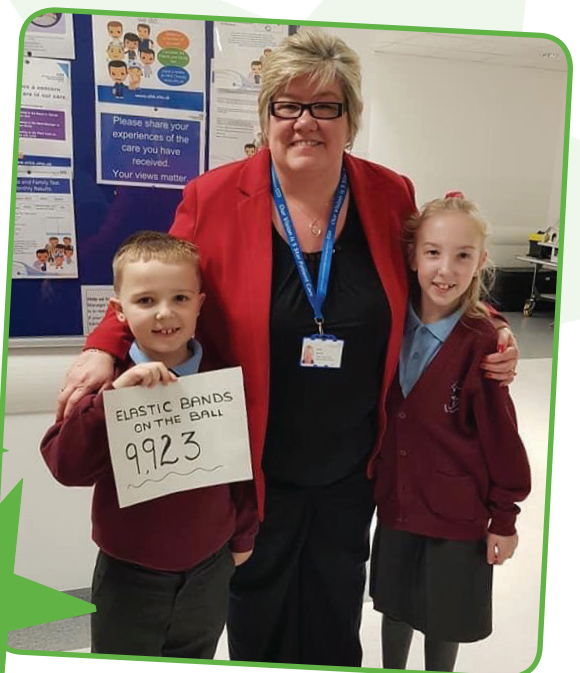

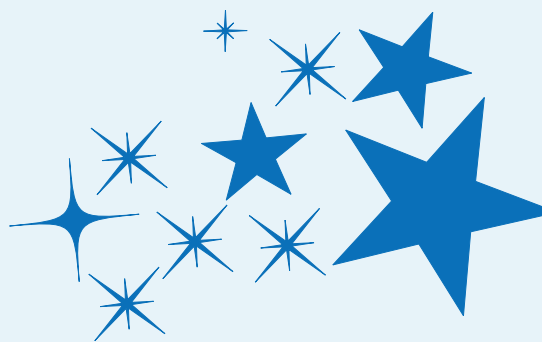
